- Campers may arrive on campus as early as 8:20am.
- Early enrollment is advised as classes have limited spaces available. Camper/teacher ratios will be strictly enforced.
- Each camper should bring a small snack each day.
- An after camp program is not available. All campers must be picked up promptly at 11:30am. Campers not picked up prior to 11:35am will be assessed a \$10 fee. That fee will be raised to \$20 at 11:45am.

Week 1 – LIFE ON THE FARM

Week 2 – FUN WITH FABLES AND FAIRY TALES

Once upon a time, there was a fabulous class filled with dragons, fairies, magic spells, and fantasy. Travel into enchanted worlds as we enjoy some of the most famous fables and fairy tales. Students will build literacy through stories and creative writing. Jack and the Bean Stalk math, building the Three Little Pigs’ houses and making Fizzing Fairy Potions are just some of the activities that make this course a true happily ever after!

Week 3 – LET’S GET WILD AT THE ZOO

Come join us, Junior Zoo Keepers, for an exciting week filled with animals of all shapes and sizes! We’ll have a “roaring” good time participating in reading, science, and math activities all centered around some of our favorite zoo animals!

Week 4 – THE WONDERFUL WORLD OF DR. SEUSS

Oh the places we’ll go during this week in the wonderful world of Dr. Seuss! From Green Eggs and Ham to The Cat in the Hat, Dr. Seuss provides literary treasures to ignite a child’s love for reading. Art projects, math, and writing will help prepare students for the next grade level. “The more that you read, the more things you will know. The more that you learn, the more places you’ll go.” – Dr. Seuss

Reading, Writing, and Literacy Through the Seasons

Reading, reading comprehension, and creative writing are key components for success in school. Students will read exciting books, have daily writing prompts, and have fun brainstorming alone and with partners about writing ideas. Students will also improve grammar, punctuation, and spelling skills. These activities will strengthen skills and get students ready for school in August. Students will take home a book at the end of each week that will include their weekly writing and illustrations.

Week 1 – WINTER

Students will write to inform. Topics will include: how to build a snowman, and how to catch a snowflake. Students will also learn facts and write about The Winter Olympics. A fun winter craft will be included this week.

Week 2 – SPRING

Students will use opinion and expository writing. Topics will include: Would you rather be a butterfly or a bee? How would you catch a ladybug? Students will research and complete an expository writing and craft about an insect.

Week 3 – SUMMER

Students will learn how to use persuasive writing. Students will have a choice of topics and decide how to persuade the reader. We will also have fun with different types of poetry and painting.

Week 4 – FALL

Students will write about facts and opinion. We will end the week with “Roll a Story”, students will roll dice to determine characters and setting. Students will write a narrative, and make a craft related to what they roll.

Technology Camps (Fourth-Seventh Grade) \$400 per two-week session

Lego Robotics (5-12 campers per two-week session)

Learn, design, build, problem solve, and program the most advanced technology machines on the globe... Robots! Using LEGO Mindstorm NXT robotics kits, students will work in teams to problem solve and build numerous mission specific robots to compete against other teams in real-world challenges like robo-soccer, obstacle elements, robo-hill climber, sumo-robot, robo-darts, and much more. Using Lego elements, motors, and several advance robotics sensors, teams will create amazing autonomous robots all while learning about engineering, programming, math, technology, and teamwork!

Digital Animation & Film (5-15 campers per two-week session)

Love internet games, animation, and movies? In this innovative class, students will explore the world of animation, learning about history, the different types from traditional cell and stop motion to cutting edge digital animation. Using digital cameras, professional computer software, and imagination learn how to develop stories using script, storyboards, sound editing software, and cinema techniques like green screening to create an amazing animated movie. Then using YouTube, share them with your family and friends.
